

SECTION 1. Legislative Intent.

The intent of this legislation is to prohibit commercial vehicles weighing 8,000 lbs., or more from traversing that portion of from Morris Park Lane between Three Mile Harbor Road and West Drive and West Drive and to exclude commercial vehicles in excess of 8,000 lbs., from West Drive between Springs Fireplace Road and its terminus.

SECTION 2. Amendments.

Chapter 240 (Vehicles and Traffic) is hereby amended to add the following:

§ 240-60 Schedule X: Commercial Vehicles Over Certain Weights, Lengths and/or Passenger Capacities Excluded.

SECTION 3. Authority.

The Town Board is authorized to establish and promulgate rules and regulations regarding the exclusion of trucks, commercial vehicles, tractors, tractor-trailer combinations, tractor-semitrailer combinations, or tractor-trailer-semitrailer combinations in excess of any designated weight, designated length, designated height, or eight feet in width, from highways or set limits on hours of operation of such vehicles on particular town highways or segments of such highways. Such exclusion shall not be construed to prevent the delivery or pickup of merchandise or other property along the highways from which such vehicles or combinations are otherwise excluded pursuant to Vehicle and Traffic Law of the State of New York §1660.

SECTION 4. Severability.

If any section or subsection, paragraph, clause, phrase or provision of this law shall be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, any judgment made thereby shall not affect the validity of this law as a whole or any part thereof other than the part or provisions so adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State pursuant to Municipal Home Rule Law.
