AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FREDERICKTOWN, MISSOURI TO ENACT A NEW SECTION IN TITLE II - PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE, CHAPTER 245: SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT RELATING TO DISPOSAL OF RESIDENTIAL SHARPS WASTE; ESTABLISHING THE EFFECTIVE DATE; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF FREDERICKTOWN, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A new section 245.255 is enacted in Title II – Public Health, Safety and Welfare, in Chapter 245: Solid Waste Management, relating to disposal of residential sharps waste, to read as follows:

"Section 245.225: Disposal of Residential Sharps Waste.

- A. "Sharps Waste" as used in this Section means any device or object used to puncture or lacerate the skin including, but not limited to: lancets, syringes and needles.
- B. All Sharps Waste generated on-site at a single-family residential premise or a single-family dwelling unit shall be packaged in rigid, leak-resistant and puncture-resistant containers and sealed prior to disposal with the generator's residential solid waste.
- C. Generators of Sharps Waste other than on-site at a single-family residential premise or a single-family dwelling unit shall not dispose of Sharps Waste with solid waste for City pick-up. Such generators shall comply with all applicable State statutes and regulations relating to disposal of Sharps Waste including Infectious Waste Management.
- D. A person commits the offense of improper disposal of sharps waste if he or she purposely or knowingly places for collection any device or object used to puncture or lacerate the skin that is not generated on-site at a single-family residential premise or that is not packaged in rigid, leak-resistant and puncture-resistant containers and sealed prior to disposal with the generator's residential solid waste."

Section 2. It is the intent of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Fredericktown, Missouri, and it is hereby ordained that this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Fredericktown, Missouri, and that sections of this ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

Section 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Board of Aldermen and after its approval and execution by the Mayor.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
