

**BOROUGH OF HUMMELSTOWN
ORDINANCE NO. 2023 - 01**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HUMMELSTOWN, CHAPTER 24 (TAXATION, SPECIAL), TO AMEND THE PROVISIONS IN PART 4 (REAL ESTATE AND OCCUPATION TAX); TO PROVIDE FOR THE REPEAL OF PRIOR INCONSISTENT ORDINANCE PROVISIONS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Hummelstown, Dauphin County, Pennsylvania previously duly enacted an Occupation Tax Ordinance pursuant to its statutory authority under the Local Tax Enabling Act of 1965 (Act of Dec. 31, 1965, P.L. 1257, as amended); which Ordinance was codified as Chapter 24 (Taxation, Special), Part 4 (Real Estate and Occupation Tax) of the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Hummelstown; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Hummelstown has met the procedural requirements of the Borough Code (8 Pa.C.S. § 101 *et seq.*) and of the Borough's ordinances for the adoption of the proposed ordinance, including notice and review; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Borough of Hummelstown, after due consideration of the proposed ordinance amendment at a duly advertised public meeting, has determined that the health, safety, and general welfare of the residents of the Borough of Hummelstown will be served by the proposed ordinance amendments.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ordained by the Council of the Borough of Hummelstown, Dauphin County, Pennsylvania, that Chapter 24, Part 4, as last amended by Ordinance 2021-6, of the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Hummelstown is amended as follows:

SECTION 1:

- A. Chapter 24, Taxation, Special, Part 4, Real Estate and Occupation Tax, is amended as followed with deleted text shown in brackets and struck, inserted text underlined, and ellipses to indicate unaltered text:

§ 24-402 Occupation Tax Levy.

* * *

2. Any person whose total income from all sources is less than [~~\$6,000~~] \$12,000 per annum shall be exempt from the payment of the occupation tax established by this § 24-402. The phrase "income from all sources" shall include compensation received for services rendered; net profits from the operation of a business, profession or farm; interest; dividends; rents, royalties, patents and copyrights; income from estates and trusts; and gambling and lottery winnings, other than prizes of the Pennsylvania State Lottery won on

or after July 21, 1985. The term "compensation," as used herein, shall mean all types of payments for service rendered or to be rendered in the future, whether received in cash or in the form of wages, fees, tips, gratuities, commissions, bonuses, incentive payments, vacation or holiday pay, termination or severance pay, sick pay (unless excluded), stock options, educational stipends, meals and lodging not provided for the convenience of the employer, reimbursement in excess of allowable business expenses and any other income received for services rendered.

SECTION 2. Repealer.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith or in conflict with any of the specific terms enacted hereby, to the extent of said inconsistencies or conflicts, are hereby specifically repealed; provided, however, that this Ordinance shall in no way effect or repeal the provisions of any Ordinance imposing any real estate tax, real estate transfer tax, per capita tax, earned income tax, local services tax, or any other tax imposed under the Local Tax Enabling Act, as amended, all of which taxes shall continue in effect as provide by law.

SECTION 3. Severability.

In the event any provisions, sections, sentences, clause, or part of this Ordinance Amendment shall be held to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity, illegality, or unconstitutionality shall not affect or impair the remaining provisions, sections, sentences, clauses, or parts of this Ordinance Amendment, it being the intent of the Borough Council that the remainder of the Ordinance Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. Effective Date.


This Ordinance Amendment shall take effect and be in force after its enactment by the Borough Council of the Borough of Hummelstown as provided by law.



PUBLIC NOTICE

The Borough Council of the Borough of Hummelstown, Dauphin County, Pennsylvania will hold a public meeting on January 19, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. at the Borough Municipal Building, 261 Quarry Road Hummelstown, PA 17036, at which meeting the Borough Council will consider the enactment of a proposed ordinance amending and updating the Borough's real estate and occupation tax rates, Chapter 24 (Taxation, Special), Part 4 (Real Estate and Occupation Tax). The title and summary of the proposed ordinance are as follows:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HUMMELSTOWN, CHAPTER 24 (TAXATION, SPECIAL), TO AMEND THE PROVISIONS IN PART 4 (REAL ESTATE AND OCCUPATION TAX); TO PROVIDE FOR THE REPEAL OF PRIOR INCONSISTENT ORDINANCE PROVISIONS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF.

Section 1 Amends Part 4 (Real Estate and Occupation Tax) of Chapter 24 (Taxation, Special) of the Code of Ordinances of the Borough of Hummelstown, by increasing rate of income exempted from the imposition of such tax.

Section 2 is a severability section providing that if any provision of the proposed Ordinance is invalid, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3 repeals all prior ordinances or parts thereof that are inconsistent with the proposed Ordinance. Section 4 provides that the proposed Ordinance shall become effective in accordance with applicable law.

The full text of the proposed amendatory ordinance is on file for inspection and review without charge (or a copy may be obtained for a charge not greater than the cost thereof) at the Hummelstown Borough Municipal Building, 261 Quarry Road Hummelstown, PA 17036.
