

ORDINANCE 2019-156

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1 OF THE EXISTING ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF LINDENWOLD REGULATING GENERAL PENALTY

WHEREAS, the Municipal Governing Body of the Borough of Lindenwold wishes to ensure consistency in its provisions, and

WHEREAS, a review of Chapter 1, Article I regarding the penalties of the Borough of Lindenwold has been reviewed, and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Governing Body have approved these recommendations to Chapter 1 General Provisions, Article 1 General Penalty; Construal of Provisions of the Code of the Borough of Lindenwold as follows:

Article I General Penalty; Construal of Provisions

§ 1-1 Violations and penalties.

A. Maximum penalty. For violation of any provisions of this chapter, any other chapter of this Code or any other ordinance of the Borough, the maximum penalty, upon conviction, shall be one or more of the following: imprisonment in the county jail or in any place provided by the municipality for the detention of prisoners, for any term not exceeding 90 days; or by a fine not exceeding \$2,500; or by a period of community service not exceeding 90 days. In the event that the legislature authorizes an increase in penalties in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:49-5, then and in that event it is the intent of this subsection that any and all such increased penalties shall apply to any violations occurring hereunder.

B. Upon conviction of any provisions of this chapter, a minimum penalty of up to \$100.00 shall be imposed upon the offender.


C. Upon conviction of any Ordinance or Section of the Code pertaining to the unlawful disposal of solid waste or mandatory recyclable source separation requirements as set forth in Section 276-8, a minimum penalty of up to \$100.00 and a maximum penalty not to exceed \$10,000 shall be imposed on the offender.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the municipal governing body of the Borough of Lindenwold that Chapter 1, Article I be amended as stated.

This ordinance shall take effect upon proper passage and publication according to law.
