ORDINANCE #18-2023

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING
CHAPTER 102, PERSONNEL POLICIES
OF THE BOROUGH OF NORTH HALEDON**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of North Haledon, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey, that:

Section 1.

Chapter 102, Personnel Policies shall be amended as follows:

§102-32. Personal Days.

Employees shall be entitled to three non-cumulative personal leave days between January 1 and December 31 of each year. Arrangements for such leave shall be made by the employee with the department head at least 48 hours in advance. Such leave shall be granted without loss of pay. Personal days shall not be taken in connection with a holiday or a vacation day.

Section 2.

All other parts or provisions of the Code of the Borough of North Haledon not specifically amended by this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3.

This Ordinance shall take effect as provided by law.
