

ORDINANCE 2021-03-02

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT PARKING ON PORTIONS OF
S. SHORE DRIVE AND E. SHORE DRIVE

WHEREAS, the Village of Richfield’s parking ordinances are regulated by Chapter 351 of the Village’s Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to ensure that all roadways in the Village traversable to local traffic; and

WHEREAS, another important component of roadway safety is the ability to be accessed by emergency services personnel; and

WHEREAS, amending these ordinances and placing new signage on portions of S. Shore Drive and portions of E. Shore Drive will help with a number of parking issues related to the growing and expanding use of the Bark Lake Boat Launch; and

WHEREAS, the Village intends to place new signage on S. Shore Drive and E. Shore Drive to further define the boundaries of parking versus no parking zones and intend to amend their ordinances to codify the same.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Village of Richfield Village Board, Washington County, Wisconsin ordains as follows:

Section 1. Section 351-39, which is entitled “Parking Prohibited” is hereby amended to ADD the following parking restrictions in alphabetical order, as follows:

| <u>Name of Street</u> | <u>Side</u> | <u>Location</u> |
|-----------------------|-------------|---|
| South Shore Drive | Both | From Address point 3316 S. Shore Drive to 3320 S. Shore Drive |
| South Shore Drive | Both | From Address point 786 S. Shore Drive to 793 S. Shore Drive |
| East Shore Drive | Both | From commencement of roadway 689’ towards terminus |

Section 2. Section 351-39, which is entitled “Parking Prohibited” is hereby amended to DELETE the following parking restriction:

~~South Shore Drive Both From Bark Lake Road to Lakeview Avenue~~

Section 3. Effective Date

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and posting or publication as provided by law.

Section 4. The several sections of this ordinance are declared to be severable. If any section or portion thereof shall be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, unlawful, or unenforceable, such decision shall apply only to the specific Section or portion thereof directly specified in the decision, and shall not affect the validity of any other provisions, Sections, or portions thereof of the ordinance. The remainder of the ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. Any other ordinances whose terms are in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to those terms and conflict.
