

**BOND ORDINANCE TO AMEND IN ITS ENTIRETY THE BOND ORDINANCE (ORD. NO. 2022-020) ENTITLED: "BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY AND NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF ROCHELLE PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$1,853,700 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO APPROPRIATE VARIOUS GRANTS, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS," ADOPTED ON NOVEMBER 23, 2022.**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Rochelle Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The bond ordinance (Ord. No. 2022-020) entitled:

"BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY AND NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF ROCHELLE PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$1,853,700 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO APPROPRIATE VARIOUS GRANTS, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH

APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS"

adopted by the Township Committee of the Township of Rochelle Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Township") on November 23, 2022 (the "Prior Ordinance") is hereby amended in its entirety (including the title) in order to (A) (i) increase the appropriation and estimated cost in Section 4.A of the ordinance from \$1,351,200 to \$1,901,200 (an increase of \$550,000); (ii) increase the State grants appropriated in Section 4.A from \$926,000 to \$1,196,810 (an increase of \$270,810); (iii) increase the down payment appropriated in Section 4.A from \$20,250 to \$33,640 (an increase of \$13,390); and (iv) increase the bonds and notes authorized in Section 4.A from \$404,950 to \$670,750 (an increase of \$265,800); (B) (i) increase the total aggregate appropriation and estimated cost for the ordinance from \$1,853,700 to \$2,403,700 (an increase of \$550,000); (ii) increase the total aggregate grants appropriated for the ordinance from \$926,000 to \$1,196,810 (an increase of \$270,810); (iii) increase the total aggregate down payment appropriated for the ordinance from \$44,300 to \$57,690 (an increase of \$13,390); and (iv) increase the total aggregate amount of bonds and notes for the ordinance from \$883,400 to \$1,149,200 (an increase of \$265,800); (C) increase the estimated amount of statutorily permitted expenses included in the total appropriation for the ordinance from \$240,000 to \$300,000 (an increase of \$60,000); (D) decrease the average period of usefulness of the purposes authorized in the ordinance from 10.75 years to 10.58 years (a decrease of 0.17 years); (E) add a new Section 8 to the ordinance appropriating an additional New Jersey Department of Transportation grant in the amount of \$270,810 for the cost of the resurfacing of Howard Avenue authorized in Section 4.A; and (F) renumber existing Sections 8 to 18 as Sections 9 to 19, respectively, and shall hereafter read as follows:

"BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF NEW ADDITIONAL OR REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT AND MACHINERY AND NEW COMMUNICATION AND SIGNAL SYSTEMS EQUIPMENT IN, BY AND FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF ROCHELLE PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$2,403,700 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO APPROPRIATE VARIOUS GRANTS, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

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BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Rochelle Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Township of Rochelle Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Township") is hereby authorized to make various public improvements and to acquire new additional or replacement equipment and machinery and new communication and signal systems equipment in, by and for said Township, as more particularly described in Section 4 hereof. The cost of the improvements includes all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes"), the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for said respective purposes. Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized, and the down payment and various grants appropriated, by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Township.

Section 4. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued are set forth in the following "Schedule of Improvements, Purposes and Amounts" which schedule also shows (1) the amount of the appropriation and the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the grants hereinafter appropriated, and (3) the amount of each sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance such purposes, and (4) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (5) the period of usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

SCHEDULE OF IMPROVEMENTS, PURPOSES AND AMOUNTS

A. Resurfacing of Howard Avenue, including reconstruction of sidewalks, curbs and driveway aprons, tree removal and drainage improvements, where necessary. It is hereby determined and stated that said road being improved is of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

B. Acquisition of new additional or replacement equipment and machinery for the use of the Police Department consisting of (i) firearms and (ii) body cameras and related equipment.

Bonds and Notes Authorized	\$ 68,500
Period of Usefulness	5 years

C. Acquisition of new additional or replacement equipment and machinery and new communication and signal systems equipment for the use of the Police Department consisting of (i) security cameras, (ii) license plate readers, (iii) radio equipment and (iv) a digital radio recorder.

D. Acquisition of new additional or replacement equipment and machinery consisting of landscaping equipment for the use of the Department of Public Works.

E. Acquisition of new additional or replacement equipment and machinery and new communication and signal systems equipment for the use of the Fire Department consisting of

(i) turnout gear, (ii) water rescue equipment, (iii) self-contained breathing apparatus equipment, (iv) radios and (v) extrication equipment.

F. Undertaking of improvements to the sanitary and stormwater sewer systems at various locations in the Township.

Section 5. The cost of such purposes, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$300,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 6. The sum of \$725,000 received or to be received as a grant from the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation (the "NJDOT") is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the resurfacing of Howard Avenue authorized in Section 4.A hereof.

Section 7. The sum of \$201,000 received or to be received as a grant from the NJDOT is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the resurfacing of Howard Avenue authorized in Section 4.A hereof.

Section 8. The sum of \$270,810 received or to be received as a grant from the NJDOT is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the resurfacing of Howard Avenue authorized in Section 4.A hereof.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$57,690, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Township, are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$57,690 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 10. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,149,200 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 11. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,149,200 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 12. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations



prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said bond anticipation notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Township and attested by the Municipal Clerk or Deputy Municipal Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 13. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or notes authorized for said purposes, is a period of 10.58 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 14. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Municipal Clerk of said Township, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Township, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$1,149,200 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 15. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purposes (other than the State grants hereinbefore appropriated which shall be applied to the cost of such purposes, but shall not be applied to the payment of outstanding bond anticipation notes and the reduction of the amount of bonds authorized), shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued,



to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 16. The Township intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Sections 1 and 4 of this bond ordinance. If the Township incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Township hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 17. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Township, and the Township shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.


Section 18. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Municipal Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 19. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage."

Section 2. This amendatory bond ordinance shall supersede the Prior Ordinance, and all contracts, expenditures, encumbrances and charges made pursuant to the Prior Ordinance shall be deemed to have been made pursuant to this amendatory bond ordinance.

Section 3. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this amendatory bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Township Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.
