LOCAL LAW #1-2018 LETTER OF MAP REVISION ISSUED BY THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY.

PURPOSE AND JUSTIFICATION:

The Purpose of this local law is to adopt revisions to the Flood Insurance Rate Map as required by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

BE IT ENACTED by the Village of Spring Valley, follows:

Section 1. Section 126, Flood Damage Prevention, of the Village of Spring VALley Code is hereby amended as follows:

S 126-6 A is hereby amended in its entirety as follows:

A. the areas of special flood hazard are indentified and defined on the following documents prepared by the Federal emergency Agency:

(1) Flood Insurance Map 36087C015G and 36087C0093G whose effective date March 3, 2014.

(2) Letter of Map Revision effective March 3, 2014 FEMA case No.17-020-04104P.
