

Mayor Dunwell called the Meeting of the Common Council of the Borough of Alpha to order at 7:00 P.M. on July 25, 2017.

Mayor Dunwell announced that adequate notice of the meeting was given and posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building satisfying the requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act:

Pursuant to the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting has been given. On January 1st, 2017, the Municipal Clerk delivered to the Star Gazette/Express-Times and posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building a notice containing the date, time, and place of this meeting of the Alpha Borough Council. Also said notice has been mailed to persons requesting the same.

Mayor Dunwell led the prayer and flag salute.

Roll Call: Present, Councilman Cartabona, Councilwoman Grossman, Councilman Guerrera, and Councilman Schwar.

Absent: Councilman Pettinelli and Councilman Seiss.

Public Comment:

Joey Fiore, Morris Street, inquired about why two members of Council were not present tonight.

Lisa Vanwache, *address inaudible*, stated that LMR had a member out last meeting, and to consider that while making a vote tonight.

Charles Bodogh, East Central Avenue, inquired about when the dead tree on 1st Avenue was going to be cut down.

Ed Mason, East Blvd, advised that two consecutive Sundays the dump was not open.

John Schmidt, Schley Avenue, advised that he has been billed for 60,000 gallons of water. He also inquired about what happened with the Hobson and Schley Avenue stop sign issue.

Leo Pursell, High Street, inquired about the amount of the pool costs and how that money will be spent. He also advised that part of the sidewalk is cut off on High Street, and asked if it was going to stay that way.

John D'Angelo, Springtown Road, inquired about whether or not the soccer fields were ready to go yet. He also inquired about removing the curbs on the basketball courts.

Mike Savary, Park Avenue, inquired if we have a date for the water softener to be up and running. He also inquired if the four way stop by the school has ever had a traffic study.

Lisa LaCaruba, Springtown Rd, inquired about who will act as the Mayor while he is away. She also inquired about the HOMA Lane Project. Lastly, Ms. LaCaruba inquired about the Borough having an acting clerk.

Any person wishing to reserve the park pavilion must apply for a permit after February 1st of the current year and shall pay a flat fee of \$50 to the Borough of Alpha.

**RESOLUTION 2017-113
RESOLUTION AWARDED A CONTRACT
FOR SWIMMING POOL RECONSTRUCTION AND REHABILITATION**

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Alpha have determined that the municipal swimming pool and pump house building are in need of reconstruction and renovations; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Alpha, through the Borough Engineer, have openly and publicly solicited bids (now, a second time) for such reconstruction contract for said pool work, pursuant to New Jersey law; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Alpha has, this second time, received the lowest responsible bid from Ray Palmer Associates, Inc. of Dover, New Jersey, based on the recommendation of the Borough Engineer.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha, County of Warren, State of New Jersey that the said contract for the contemplated work –reconstruction of the municipal swimming pool and renovations to the pump house building – is hereby awarded to Ray Palmer Associates, Inc. of Dover, New Jersey, having submitted a bid, Alternate Bid #1, of \$277,600.00 for said work, upon written certification of funds by the Borough CFO.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor, Clerk, Borough Attorney, and/or Borough Engineer are authorized to execute all necessary documents to effectuate the contract.

Councilwoman Grossman gave a detailed explanation on how the money will be spent on rehabilitating the pool. She explained that in February there were two bids, one was for the pool house (which received no bids), and the other was for the work that needed to be done for the pool (which received two bids). She stated that the lowest bidder was \$720,000. Councilwoman Grossman explained that before they put this project out to bid, they should have done some of the volunteer work to check the condition of the pool. She stated that once they got to working on the pool, they came across the following: the electric is operational, the plumbing works, the interior is in excellent condition with minor cracks, and one skimmer has a minor leak. She also stated that volunteers could help to reduce the cost of fixing up the pump house.

To show the breakdown in costs for the rehabilitation, Councilwoman Grossman made a spread sheet to show building costs versus pool cost. She stated that she would bring volunteers in to help with cosmetic work. Councilwoman Grossman also went on to explain that she would like to see the building open from April-October to offer more than just a pool building. She explained some ideas such as making one of the rooms into an arcade and making it into a club instead of just a pool. Also, to avoid a tax increase, she had the idea of having businesses sponsor the pool.

Councilwoman Grossman stated what the final bids were. The material only bid came in at \$120,640.00 and the equipment/installation bid came in at \$277,000.00. Councilwoman Grossman stated that to open the pool (which includes the parking lot,

pool, pump house and building) would be estimated at a “not to exceed” price of \$639,156.00.

Councilwoman Grossman also stated that if it is decided to demolish the pool, it will still cost close to \$203,000.00 to update the building.

At this time, Councilwoman Grossman listed off a bunch of cost saving ways to make the bid prices lower by sprucing up areas already there, such as fencing.

Councilman Cartabona asked the engineer if we still have 60 days to award a contract from the bid opening date.

Councilwoman Grossman and Councilman Cartabona thanked everyone for coming to the meeting tonight and the volunteers for all of their help.

At this time, Mayor Dunwell opened up discussion for the public on this topic.

Jodie Smith, 5th Avenue, stated that she would like for Council to remember how the residents voted for the pool. She also stated that she thinks the pool would be great for the children and even the adults in town.

Leo Pursell, High Street, inquired about the bid amount and if we are going to go out to bid again.

Joey Fiore, Morris Street, inquired about the operating costs of the pool and if John Dolak was still interested in donating to the pool.

Lloyd Best, Dewey Avenue, expressed how much he would love to see the pool open for everyone in the borough.

John Schmidt, Schley Avenue, asked if this is tabled until the September 11th meeting, will it be tabled again if not all members of Council are present.

Kim Guerrera, Williams Street, asked how many times this can be tabled.

Mike Savary, Park Avenue, asked about moving forward on fixing the building if the pool doesn't open.

Audra Frank, weighed in and stated that she is supposed to meet with contractors about getting the roof on the pool building done.

John D'Angelo, Springtown Road, inquired about operating and membership costs. He also stated that AYAA community services could help with the pool.

At this time, Mayor Dunwell closed the open discussion on the pool topic.

Motion made by Councilman Schwar to approve Resolution 117-114, motion seconded by Councilwoman Grossman. Roll Call: Ayes; Councilman Cartabona, Councilwoman Grossman, Councilman Guerrera, and Councilman Schwar.

**RESOLUTION 2017-115
RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING MAYOR TO EXECUTE
THE RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE INVENTORY (ROSI) FOR GREEN ACRES**

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha, County of Warren, State of New Jersey formally recognizes that certain Borough properties are part of an inventory kept on record with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Green Acres Program; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has an ongoing project with the Green Acres Program, which requires a certification from the Borough to the Borough's Recreation and Open Space Inventory (ROSI) on file with the Green Acres Program.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha, County of Warren, State of New Jersey, that the Honorable Craig S. Dunwell, Mayor, is hereby authorized to execute the ROSI, certifying the said inventory as referenced above to the Green Acres Program as part of the project number 2102-07-010, entitled "Alpha Borough Open Space".

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Alpha, County of Warren, State of New Jersey, that the Mayor, Council President, and Clerk are hereby authorized to sign any and all documents required by the Green Acres Program or others in connection with the purchase of open space from Brian Properties.

Department Reports:

Administration, Councilman Guerrera: Councilman Guerrera stated that he had no report. In closing, Councilman Guerrera signed all bills, salaries and wages for his department.

Finance, Councilman Schwar: Councilman Schwar reported that the bills are substantially higher this month. He stated that out of \$1.1 million dollars, over a million of it is for the Alpha School Board and the County for quarterly taxes. Councilman Schwar stated that there are a few bills he questioned on the bill list such as #474, #475, #476, #477, and #478. He stated that they are bills for the South Warren Municipal Alliance that we aren't paying. He stated that they are checks that we are writing and collecting money from other municipalities. In closing, Councilman Schwar approved all bills, salaries and wages for his department.

Health & Welfare, Councilman Pettinelli: Councilman Schwar reported on Councilman Pettinelli's behalf. He had no report, but stated that he will sign his bills.

Public Property, Councilwoman Grossman: Councilwoman Grossman stated that she had no report. In closing, Councilwoman Grossman approved all bills, salaries and wages for her department.

Public Safety, Councilman Thomas Seiss: Councilman Schwar reported on Councilman Seiss's behalf. He reported that there was a handicap application for a resident on 5th Avenue, but it needs a resolution to be approved.

Public Works, Councilman Louis Cartabona: Councilman Cartabona reported that he is interested in making sure that the sodium hydroxide is removed so that we can start the plant back up. Mayor Dunwell stated that we have received a quote, and we were just waiting for a credit application that has to be done by the CFO. In closing, Councilman Cartabona approved all bills, salaries and wages for his department.

At this time, Councilman Schwar stated that Councilman Pettinelli has one bill, so he approved his bills, salaries and wages. He also stated that Councilman Seiss had no bills, but he approved his salaries and wages.

Professionals & Official Reports:

Mayor, Craig S. Dunwell: Mayor Dunwell reported that previously Councilman Pettinelli had questioned his Verizon telephone records due to them not showing the call detail. He stated that he has the records now if anyone would like to view them. Mayor Dunwell also reported that he received a call from the Arc of Warren County, (who owns the group home on Pohatcong Street) stating that they wanted to put up a shed with a waiver of permit fees. Mayor Dunwell asked for a motion to waive the fees. No motion was made. Moving on, Mayor Dunwell reported that he attended a meeting with NJ DEP regarding the landfill disruption permit for solid waste management. He stated that NJ

DEP said that we may go with a closure between 78 and the railroad tracks instead of a landfill disruption permit. Mayor Dunwell also reported that he received a call from a resident who filled his swimming pool and doesn't want to pay sewer for it since the water didn't go into the sanitary sewer. Mayor Dunwell advised residents that the only way to avoid paying sewer in instances like this, is to have a second water meter installed. At this time, Mayor Dunwell requested 55 minutes in executive session for contractual and litigation.

Police Department, Chief Robert Stettner: Chief Stettner had no report. Councilman Cartabona inquired about National Night Out and Chief Stettner verified that it is this upcoming Tuesday. Mayor Dunwell asked where it was being held this year, and Chief Stettner stated that it will be held at Shapell Park from 5-7pm.

Engineer, Frank J. Seney: Mr. Seney referred everyone to the latest July report, previously handed out. Mayor Dunwell inquired about the increase gas tax and funding within the state, and whether or not the amount of aid money for roads was going to increase. Mr. Seney stated that it was going to be doubled. Councilman Schwar inquired with Council about submitting for the 32 parcels. Specifically, from the southern end of 5th Avenue and North Boulevard to West Boulevard. Mayor Dunwell asked Mr. Seney if it was his recommendation that we apply for either one or both of the previously submitted applications.

Code Enforcement, Thomas Fey: Mr. Fey stated that he had previously forwarded his report to Councilman Guerrero.

Second Public Comment:

Mike Savary, Park Avenue, inquired about handicap spots. He asked if just anyone can park in any handicap spot. He also inquired about how often the soccer teams practice.

At this time, Councilman Cartabona requested 5 minutes in executive session for contractual.

Tom Fey, East Boulevard, inquired about how many votes you need to pass an ordinance.

Payment of Bills & Claims:

Councilman Cartabona made a motion to make the director's report a part of the minutes. Councilwoman Grossman seconded the motion, all were in favor.

Councilman Cartabona made a motion that the CFO be authorized to pay all bills authorized by the director. Councilman Schwar seconded the motion. Roll call: Ayes; Cartabona, Grossman, Guerrero, and Schwar. Nays: none.

Councilman Schwar made a motion that the CFO be authorized to pay all salaries and wages approved by the director, Councilwoman Grossman seconded. Roll call: Ayes; Cartabona, Grossman, Guerrero, and Schwar. Nays: none.

New Business:

Motion made by Councilman Cartabona to approve Pavilion Permit without alcohol for David Newell: August 6th, seconded by Councilwoman Grossman. Roll Call; Ayes: Cartabona, Grossman, Guerrero, and Schwar.

Executive Session:

Councilman Schwar made a motion to approve the following resolution to go back into executive session for 60 minutes for contractual, litigation, and/or personnel. Motion seconded by Councilwoman Grossman, all were in favor.

EXECUTIVE SESSION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, P.L. 1975, permits the exclusion of the public from a meeting in certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, this public body is of the opinion that such circumstances presently exist.

Motion made by Councilman Schwar to authorize the mayor to sign a contract to provide to the Borough a C2 sewer collection systems for Water Resource Management, motion seconded by Councilwoman Grossman, all were in favor.
