Important News Update

Dear Bannockburn Residents,

President Trump and Governor Pritzker have extended the stay at home order until the end of April. In addition, the state and federal tax filing deadline was pushed to 7/15/20.

As everyone has predicted, this week has seen substantial increases in people being diagnosed with the virus. We have been staying home to try to flatten the infection curve which will give hospitals and healthcare workers time to prepare for serious cases.

My recommendation is to “Act as if you have the Virus”. If you have a fever or cough, stay home, self-quarantine and call your doctor. If you have to go out, practice your social distancing of 6 feet, wash your hands often, wipe your phone and avoid touching your face.

Bannockburn Village Board Meeting Special Procedures

Although the COVID-19 pandemic is disrupting all of our lives, the Village of Bannockburn is trying to maintain its operations as best as possible. Our plan is to conduct the regular Village Board meeting on April 13, 2020, as scheduled.

As a result of the requirements set forth in various executive orders of Governor Pritzker, the Village Board meeting will be conducted in a different manner from our normal in person Board meetings. Here are a few things you should know:

- The meeting will not be held at a physical location. Instead, it will be conducted electronically. Please check the **Village Board Agenda** find out how you can attend the meeting virtually.
- The opportunities for public comment will be limited to comments that are e-mailed to the Village. **Special Regulations** regarding public comments are posted on the website. Any comments can be e-mailed to **Ryan Mentkowski** and will be posted on the Village website.

Circumstances relating to the State’s efforts to reduce the spread of COVID-19 remain fluid, so the information above could change. Please check the Village website for any updated information.

The Beeson Corner Proposal

The Village Board will have the Beeson Corner proposal before it for further consideration on April 13. To the extent that any person has any thoughts or comments to offer on this topic that have not previously been communicated to the Village Board, please send them in a succinct e-mail to the Village at **Ryan Mentkowski** as noted above, these will be posted on the Village website.

For your information, the Village Board could take one of the following actions at the meeting:

- 1) To approve the development as presented – the four story proposal.
- 2) To refer the development back to the PCZBA to conduct hearings on the three story

revised proposal, (with corresponding directions to update the approval documents for future Village Board consideration.

3) To terminate consideration of the development proposal.

The Village Board would appreciate any comments on this topic before 12 noon on Wednesday, April 8, 2020.
