Lake County has taken measures to manage the COVID-19 impact on Lake County residents. One results has been the creation of **Lake County Forward**.

The Importance of Contact Tracing

In order to slow the spread of COVID-19, the Lake County Health Department uses **contact tracing** to identify and notify people who may have been exposed. If you have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, we will call you and ask you to self-quarantine at home for 14 days from the day that you were exposed.

Their mission is to provide support for for the challenges faced by community health and economic recovery.

Here are some accomplishments to date:

- \$42 million to reimburse local municipalities, fire protection districts, and other taxing bodies for COVID-19 expenses
- \$28.05 million for Lake County essential services related to COVID-19
- \$17 million for small business and economic assistance
- \$15.7 million for public health support and assistance, including contact tracing, health education, vaccinations, behavioral health and other services
- \$15 million for food, rental, utility, housing, employment and other resident support and assistance
- \$1.75 million for the stockpile and distribution of personal protective equipment
- \$2.04 million contingency/reserve for other COVID-19 related expenses.

Here is what to expect from Contract Tracing:

The Health Department will contact you via phone and then via text. The information is voluntary.

Contact tracers interview people who test positive for COVID-19 over the phone, help them recall where they have been and who they have seen while infectious.

Contact tracers notify the COVID-19 case's close contacts about their possible exposure. They do not disclose the name or any other personal details of the COVID-19 case to the contacts.

After speaking with a contact tracer, people who need to self-quarantine will be asked to log their symptoms each day using new contact tracing software implemented by the State of Illinois. These daily messages will be sent via email or text messages
