



Public Safety Committee Meeting Minutes
May 3, 2016
6:30 p.m.
Rosemary Heflin Council Chambers

I. Roll Call

A meeting of the Bellevue Borough Public Safety Committee was called to order at 6:45 P.M. by Councilperson Sevinsky.

In attendance were Councilperson Senvisky (Chair), Mayor Cusick, Coder (arrival at 6:45 P.M.), Saylor, Police Chief Sentner, Fire Marshall Wissner and DAS Borczyk, Code Enforcement Officer Delcroix and Fire Chief Pritchard were absent.

II. Public Contribution (5 minutes per person)

George Dudash of North Western EMS presented a written report to the Committee. Mr. Dudash also discussed the role of QRS and informed the Committee that he had an issue with the role of QRS as they interact with the EMT force.

Eli Zlokas, 287 N. Balph Avenue addressed the Committee concerning the condition of Maryland Avenue. Mr. Zlokas noted that the Borough had the area surveyed (six years ago), but, has concerns about the condition of the avenue requested that it be cleaned up.

IV. Old Business:

i. Police Vehicle Purchase

Chief Sentner asked the Committee to consider the purchase of a new police vehicle. He will submit the hard cost of the vehicle to DAS Borczyk so that he can get leasing information.

ii. North Avenue Parking

Chief Sentner will map out his recommendation to alleviate the dangerous situation that exists with the current parking on North Avenue. The Committee suggested a resident survey to assess the opinions of the residents affected.

V. New Business:

Mayor Cusick informed the Committee of a need for a stop sign at Cedar and Kendall

Avenues as traffic currently does not stop. He believes that a cost study is needed and inquired as to the potential cost to the Borough.

Councilperson Coder made a Motion to prepare a Resolution to join the Live Well Allegheny program as part of the agenda for the Pre-Council Meeting of May 10, 2016. The Motion was seconded by Councilperson Saylor who mentioned that he would like to see the Northgate School District involved.

Councilperson Coder asked where we were on Rental Inspections.

Fire Marshall Wissner informed the Committee that he wished to purchase a tablet. The amount would be under \$ 1,000.00 and was in the 2016 Budget. He also gave the Committee a NIMS update and an update on the investigation of the Roosevelt Avenue fire.

Mayor Cusick has a complaint from the residents of Tingley Avenue. They had to move their cars to provide for Street Sweeping and no sweeping was done. DAS Borczyk informed Mayor Cusick that the Street Sweeper had been out of service for a substantial period as it was in need of repair. Mayor Cusick suggested some notification protocol.
