I. Roll Call

A meeting of the Bellevue Borough Public Safety Committee was called to order at 6:30 P.M. by Councilperson Senvisky.

In attendance were Councilpersons Senvisky, Saylor, Mayor Cusick, DAS Borczyk, Police Chief Sentner, Fire Marshall Wissner, Fire Chief Pritchard Jr. and Code Enforcement Officer Delcroix. Councilperson Coder was absent.

III. Reports

IV. Old Business:

i. Police department restructure plan.

Police Officer Dold requested the opportunity to speak to Council about The Association of Bellevue Police comments on the plan. Councilperson Senvisky made a Motion to include the commentary on the agenda of the June 13, 2017 Pre-Council Meeting. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Saylor.

ii. Parking Ordinance

Code Enforcement Officer Delcroix reviewed the Parking Ordinance and has forwarded the document to the Solicitor for follow-up.

iii. Short-term rental Ordinance

DAS Borczyk informed Council that the Short-term Rental Ordinance was submitted to Solicitor Racunas for review.

iv. Act 172 Volunteer Firefighter/EMT Credit

DAS Borczyk informed the Committee that the Quaker Valley COG was considering a recommendation for an EIT Tax Credit for all active volunteer fire personnel. Details will be forthcoming in the future.

v. Firetruck Title Transfer

AS Borczyk informed the Committee that the title for the 2011 Pierce Fire Truck had been signed over to the Borough by the Bellevue Volunteer Fire Department as detailed in the Ordinance as passed on 2011.

V. New Business:

i. Proposal to add 10 additional permitted parking spaces to Lot 2.

After discussion by Chief Sentner, Councilperson Saylor made a Motion amend Ordinance 15-10 to add 10 additional permitted parking spaces to Lot 2. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Senvisky.

ii. Purchase of Police Vehicle

Police chief Sentner informed the Committee that he had omitted the option of an Eco-Boost Engine when he submitted the request for approval of a new police cruiser. The engine option would make the vehicle pursuit ready. Councilperson Senvisky made a Motion to include the request on the Agenda of the June 13, 2017 Pre-Council Meeting. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Saylor.

iii. Beer tasting

Mayor Cusick discussed the "Bellevue Basement Brewers Beer Bash" tasting booth, at the corner of Meade and Lincoln, that will be set up during the 150th Sesquicentennial posing that it is illegal to serve alcoholic beverages on a public street without a permit.

iv. Police Department Scheduling System purchase

Chief Sentner requested the purchase of a scheduling system at a cost of \$ 125 per month. Councilperson Senvisky made a Motion to include the request on the Agenda of the June 13, 2017 Pre-Council Meeting. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Saylor.

v. Burning Ordinance

It was requested that the Solicitor evaluate the need for a temporary permit for open burning in the Borough.
