Council Minutes
June 25, 2019

I. Call to Order

At 7:00 PM President Hrynda called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of Silence.

II. Roll Call

Present were Councilpersons Hrynda, Fodi, Hause, Saylor, Pritchard, Woshner, Pennington and Pikul. Solicitor Fraas, Treasurer Scioscia were also present. Councilperson DiTullio, DAS Borczyk and Mayor Marburger were absent.

III. Public Contribution (5 minutes per person)

Jen Slavicek – S Bryant – On behalf of Volunteer Fire Department, Ms. Slavicek requests for parking restrictions on Saturday and Sundays for Borough Lot at Municipal Building/Fire Station due to fire calls and volunteers being unable to man vehicles as they are unable to find parking. This item will be on the Agenda of the July 2, 2019 Public Safety Committee Meeting.

Mark Helbling – 558 Teece – On behalf of the Wine Crawl Committee Mr. Helbling requested an exception to the banner ordinance. Requested banner to be hung this week for the July 19th Wine Crawl/Art Festival. (This item will be discussed during new business)

Zack Frazer – 691 North Avenue – Requesting audience to discuss an incident with Meeting in January/February. This item will be on the Agenda of the July 2, 2019 Public Safety Committee Meeting.

VI. Committee Chair Reports:

a. Finance - No Report

b. Public Safety:

i. MOTION: Councilperson Pikul made a Motion to approve \$4,547.50 + Freight for Bunker Gear for the Fire Department from 3 Rivers Fire Equipment. (Budget Account No. 01.411.242.) The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Pennington and carried via seven (7) to one (1) roll call vote (Woshner – Nay).

c. Public Works:

i. MOTION: Councilperson Woshner made a Motion to approve payment to W.A. Petrakis Contracting Company for Emergency Repair of Union Avenue in the amount of \$10,742.50. (Budget Account No. 08.429.721.) The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Hause and carried via unanimous roll call vote.

ii. Councilperson Pikul requested a status update with line painting for crosswalks and red zone area at Bellevue Elementary. Councilperson Woshner will discuss with DPW supervisor.

iii. Councilperson Hause requested status update on patching large potholes on Lincoln Ave prior to large scale events (Wine Crawl/Art Fest/Sidewalk Sale). Requested in 2018 and no headway was made. Councilperson Woshner will discuss with DPW supervisor.

d. Parks:

i. Penguins Foundation Project – update. Councilperson Hrynda met with residents of Ross expressing concerns regarding drainage. Engineering has scheduled a meeting with Gateway to discuss storm sewage increases. At this point the agreement for the facility has arrived at the borough and DAS will review upon return from time off. Other areas for location have not been reviewed/discussed.

VII. Resolutions:

- i. MOTION: Councilperson Pikul made a Motion to approve Resolution No. 16-19 refunds of real estate taxes due as a result of changes in assessed values and/or overpayments. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Woshner and carried via unanimous roll call vote.
- ii. MOTION: Councilperson Pikul made a Motion to approve Resolution No. 18-19 Authorizing Application for Funding under the ALCOSAN GROW IV - Reimbursement. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Woshner and carried via unanimous roll call vote.
- iii. MOTION: Councilperson Pikul made a Motion to approve Resolution No. 19-19 Authorizing Application for Funding under the ALCOSAN GROW IV - Dawson Ave. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Hause and carried via unanimous roll call vote.

VIII. Ordinances:

- i. MOTION: Councilperson Woshner made a Motion for final reading and adoption of Ordinance No. 19-10, amending Ordinance No. 10-10 Stop sign at intersection of Means and Virginia Avenues. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Pikul and carried via seven (7) to one (1) roll call vote (Pritchard – Nay)

IX. Old Business

- i. Councilperson Saylor gave update on SINC Grant – email received 6/25/19 stating Bellevue will be awarded SINC Grant, did not have timeline or amounts currently.

X. New Business

- i. Councilperson Pikul made a Motion to hang banner across Lincoln Avenue for Wine Crawl with the exception to the five-day rule under the sign ordinance. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Saylor and carried via unanimous roll call vote. Sign ordinance to remain in Finance Committee for review of spending, etc. Also wish to have included the payment for sign hanging on Application.

XI. Approval of Bill List:

- i. MOTION: Councilperson Pennington made a Motion to approve payment of the June 25, 2019 Bill List excluding bill to B & J Golf Carts & Trailer Sales in the amount of \$435.00 out of budget account 01.410.217 and the bill to Quaker Valley COG for ECO District Training in the amount of \$250.00 out of Budget Account 01.406.420. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Pikul and carried via unanimous roll call vote. Council requested confirmation of receipt of donation from comcast to cover

payment of ECO-District training. Council requested B & J Golf Carts invoice be given directly to the Friends of the Library to pay – Not to have us pay and then get reimbursed.

XII. Public Contribution (2 minutes per person)

Jen Slavicek – S Bryant – Regarding accountability of private businesses using public property – the Shepard’s Door lunch program was approved at NO COST to the borough and they are conscious of not using any public resources, including DPW for clean-up. Concerns of her arrival Thursdays after the Farmers Market to the gazebo full of trash. This item will be included on the July 2, 2019 July public Works Committee. Additional, Columbia Hose in the past hung banners as a fundraiser for themselves and that was stopped when the borough purchased a bucket truck, The YMCA had approached them to hang the sign and was willing to give a donation, but was told the DPW would be hanging it. Would be interested in having the option to have that as a fundraiser again rather than an added expense to the borough’s fee schedule. This item will be included on Woshner to focus questions on WizardVue duties for DPW.

Connie Rankin – Arch Ave – Concerned with reciprocity of Avalon PD for Wizardvue event due to jurisdiction, etc.


XIII. Executive Session – None.
