Councilperson Pikul made a Motion to approve the requested street closures. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Saylor and passed via 7-1 voice vote (DiTullio – nay).

- i. MOTION: Motion to approve Resolution 20-19 Refunds of Real Estate Taxes due as a result of changes in assessed values and/or payments. (For action on July 23, 2019.)
- ii. MOTION: Councilperson Pikul made a Motion to approve Resolution No. 21-20 hiring Savanna McLaughlin as a Library Page at a wage not to exceed \$7.25. The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Pennington and carried via unanimous roll call vote. (Budget Account No. 04.456.112.)

The Motion was Seconded by Councilperson Saylor and carried via unanimous roll call vote.

Mayor Marburger announced that a Veteran’s Assistance Event would be held in Bellevue Council Chambers on September 12, 2019. Council Approved the event without motion or vote.

Councilperson Woshner briefed Council on a recent ACCAN Meeting concerning the clean-up of the Shenango Steel site.

Councilperson Pennington discussed a dangerous issue in the rear of Bayne Park.

Councilperson Fodi announced that he would be resigning his post, effective July 31, 2019 for personal reasons.
