<b>Public Contributions on Agenda Items (5 minute)</b>		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ There was no public contribution on agenda items.</li> </ul>		
<b>Agenda Items – Reports:</b>		
<b>1</b>	<b>Engineer; Ben Gilberti, HRG Engineers</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Mr. Gilberti reported that the pre-construction meeting for the Dawson sewer lining project was held, and the work will begin soon.</li> <li>▪ A pre-construction meeting for the 2020 street paving project will be held next week.</li> <li>▪ The manhole project and Memorial Park waterline replacement project are both out to bid.</li> </ul>	
<b>2</b>	<b>Public Works; Jim Kelly, Superintendent</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Mr. Kelly reported that Public Works has been engaged in painting curbs and trimming weeds.</li> <li>▪ The Brighton Road guiderail will be replaced Tuesday, September 8 and the road will be closed while the work is completed.</li> <li>▪ Public Works has repaired the dip in Lincoln Avenue near the Pizza Hut caused by the weight of PAT buses.</li> <li>▪ The scoreboard has been installed at the Dek Hockey rink.</li> <li>▪ Public Works will need to replace their bucket truck; Mr. Kelly is looking at used trucks at about \$20,000 and anticipates that such a truck would last about 20 years.</li> <li>▪ Mr. Kelly noted that the large arborvitae trees in front of the Borough Building need to be removed, as they obstruct views and are damaging the building. This will be put on the Pre-Council Meeting agenda.</li> <li>▪ The lowest bid to remove the dead trees on Summit Avenue was \$1,250 and Mr. Kelly recommends that the bid be approved as the trees pose a hazard.</li> <li>▪ Mr. Kelly also recommends that the Borough bid out the pool relining in October and accept the bid in November so that the work could be completed in April, 2021.</li> </ul>	
<b>Unfinished Business:</b>		
<b>1</b>	622 Tingley Avenue <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Insite Pipe will be on the property September 14 to repair the broken storm and sanitary sewer pipes, and Mr. Gilberti estimates that the work will take 2-3 days to complete.</li> <li>▪ It was noted that the basement4 windows are either flush or slightly below ground level, the basement floor drain was covered or clogged, and water was coming in active holes in the wall.</li> </ul>	

**New Business:**

- Mr. Kelly stated that leaf pickup cannot begin in the Borough if cars are parked on streets. The Police Chief has suggested that that the Police Department give notice for a week, then start enforcing the parking regulations.

**Public Contributions on Non-Agenda Items (2 minutes):**

- Joe Scioscia, 256 Lincoln Avenue: stated that the yellow line down the center of Lincoln Avenue has faded.
- Glenn Pritchard, 268 N. Balph: Noted that he responded to a storm drain that was overflowing on August 28. Mr. Kelly added that PennDOT came out and found that the drain was clogged.
