LOIS LAUTENBERG

WHEREAS, Lois Lautenberg of West Orange, New Jersey, is being remembered upon her passing from this life on Saturday, May 30, 2020, at the age of 88; and

WHEREAS, Lois Lautenberg grew up in South Orange, New Jersey. The daughter of Herman and Ann Levenson and sister to Mal; and

WHEREAS, Lois Lautenberg, later moved to Paterson with her husband, Frank Lautenberg. In 1967, the Lautenberg family moved to Montclair, New Jersey. She and her family lived in Montclair until 2007 when she moved to West Orange, New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Lois Lautenberg was well known for her philanthropic endeavors and her love of the Jewish community. She was regularly recognized for her many years of volunteerism and giving back. She was also passionate in her support of film, theater, the arts and a wide range of cultural activities and philanthropies; and

WHEREAS, Lois Lautenberg served in many capacities within the Jewish Federation of Greater MetroWest, New Jersey. She was a past Campaign Chair and President of Women's Philanthropy, a Lifetime Member of the Women's Philanthropy Board and a longtime member of the Federation's Board of Trustees. She was passionate about the work of Federation, loved being a Lion of Judah and believed in the legacy of endowing a Perpetual Annual Campaign gift to ensure a strong and vibrant Jewish future; and

WHEREAS, Lois Lautenberg was instrumental in crucial fundraising efforts at Greater MetroWest - locally, in Israel and around the world. The Lautenberg name stands proudly on buildings, meeting rooms and hallways in the Greater MetroWest community and in Israel; and

WHEREAS, Lois Lautenberg was a past co-chair of the Holocaust Council and held leadership roles at the JCC of MetroWest, JESPY House, Jewish Services for the Developmentally Disabled and the Sister Rose Thering Fund for Education in Jewish-Christian Studies at Seton Hall University. She was a role model and inspiration to all who knew her; and

WHEREAS, Lois Lautenberg was an incredibly devoted mother. She focused much of her energy on the wellbeing of her children and grandchildren. She always put her family's and her community's best interests ahead of her own. She was a selfless advocate for those in need; and

WHEREAS, Lois Lautenberg is survived by her four children, Ellen, Nan, Lisa and Josh; and 10 grandchildren; as well as countless other family, colleagues and friends; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Essex County Board of Chosen Freeholders hereby celebrates the life and mourns the passing of Lois Lautenberg and offers their heartfelt condolences to her family; and be it further
