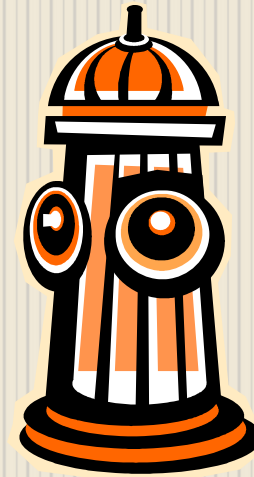

- Safety for the General Public
 - Safe streets
 - Proper signage
 - Cross walk enforcement
 - Local police radar patrols on local streets
 - No local radar patrols on Rts 40 or 322
 - That is State Police territory
 - If the State wants the revenue, let the State generate it.
 - Street lights
 - Adhere to Municipal plan on file
 - Consider removing redundant lights
 - Critical staffing elements
 - How much, how many, how soon
 - Need for professional expertise, not a generic committee



- Sidewalks

- Subdivision and site plans require construction of sidewalks and curbs in all the growth zones according to municipal standard.
 - Stricter regulation at Planning Board and Zoning Board levels.
 - Ignore begging attorneys. No waivers or variances.
- Mays Landing proper
 - On each sale or purchase of property, or construction permit, install curb and sidewalk as part of and prior to settlement or issuance of Certificate of Occupancy.
 - Municipal program – establish and start capital program of curb and sidewalk installation and repair
 - Either thru tax assessment program or
 - Capital program to install a certain number of feet per year, until all installed
 - Could be, for example, a program to install 100 feet per year or some other financially responsible dimension.



- Use of Volunteers

- Citizen Corps

- Use of volunteers to provide emergency services to allow regulars to stay out on the street
- More information can be found through NJ State Police
- Go out in municipality and meet with groups to interest volunteers.
- Use in non threatening situations.
- Make sure that everything is alright at home before leaving home to respond to a situation.
- Clerical situations in all departments, fire zone violations, Mall substation, traffic control, watchstanding

- CERT (Community Emergency Response Team)



Provide critical support to 1st responders

Provide assistance to victims

Collect disaster intelligence for 1st responders

Basic level training in first aid, fire safety, medical operations, basic EM, light search/rescue, table tops

- VIPS (Volunteers in Police Service)



Provides support and resources for local agencies

Develop and enhance skills with local agencies

Releases regular forces to function in primary duties

•Collaboration

- Government must collaborate with community leaders from all sectors for effective planning and capacity building.

•Integration

- Non-governmental assets and resources must be fully integrated in government plans, preparations, and disaster response.

•Personal/Organizational Preparedness

- Everyone in America must be fully aware, trained, and practiced on how to prevent, protect, mitigate, prepare for, and respond to all threats and hazards.

•Volunteer Service

- Citizen activism and volunteer service provides ongoing support for community safety and critical surge capacity in response and recovery.
