

July 5, 1949

A public hearing and a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees was held at the Municipal Office on July 5, 1949. Present: Mayor C. A. Eccleston, Trustees C. J. Betts, R. Chester Roberts and S. F. Jaquay, Superintendent R. H. Albrecht and Clerk J. W. Auer. Trustee Dr. J. H. Oates was absent. The hearing convened at 7:30 P. M.

No citizen of the Village attended the public hearing. At 8:30 P. M. the hearing was closed.

It was moved by C. J. Betts, seconded by S. F. Jaquay and passed that the following revision to the Village Ordinances be adopted:

ARTICLE VI11

PROVISIONS RELATING TO TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

Subdivision G

1. No vehicle may remain parked on any public street of this village for any period of more than one hour between 1 A.M. , and 7 A. M., except where authorized by parking signs.

2. No vehicle may remain parked on any public street in this village for a period of more than two hours between 8 A. M., and 6 P. M., where designated as limited parking by parking signs.

Weeds on Vacant Lots

Several complaints were reported about grass and weeds growing up on vacant lots in the Village. The Board request the Clerk to write owners of vacant lots, requesting that they have their property cleared of grass and weeds because of the annoyance and hazzard the condition causes adjoining property owners.

Appraisal of Village Property

As requested by the Board, an appraisal was made of the Village property on Utica Street. The following is the statement of the appraisers:

Pursuant to the request of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Hamilton, we have personally viewed the blueprints and have gone over the land owned by the Village of Hamilton on Utica Street, now occupied by the Esso Gas Station and after taking into consideration the location and revenue of the land, in our opinion, the property has a fair and reasonable market value of Twenty-Five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars.

Acknowledge Purchase of Police Car

It was moved by C. J. Betts, seconded by R. Chester Roberts and passed that thanks be extended to the Board of Water, Light and Sewer Comms. through Mr. Jaquay, for their purchase of a police car for Village use.

Street Improvements

It was moved by S. F. Jaquay, seconded by C. J. Betts and passed that Lebanon Street between Utica and Eaton Streets and Eaton Street between Lebanon and Utica Streets be repaved and curbed and that the curbing be assessed to adjoining property owners.

Renting at U. S. O. House

Mr. Littlefield requested that his secretary be allowed to rent an apartment at the U. S. O. House although she does not qualify as a tenant in accordance with the lease of the property. The Board decided that the University should comply with the lease in renting the apartments.

Band Concert Director


