WHEREAS, the State of New York has indicated pursuant to Chapter 578 of the Laws of 1947 that it will contribute up to 2% of the cost of the plans of approved municipal projects within the limit set by such chapter, and

WHEREAS, the Village of Hamilton wishes to make application for a grant toward the cost of the preparation of the plans for the project to make alterations and additions to the sewer treatment plant at an estimated cost of \$89,000; Now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Village of Hamilton submit this project for consideration by the Superintendent of Public Works of the State of New York with the request that an allocation be granted up to 2% of the estimated cost of construction for the preparation of plans of such project, and be it further

RESCLVED, that when and if the Superintendent approves this project, and when and if an allocation up to 2% of the cost of construction for the preparation of the plans of such approved projett is made, the Village of Hamilton will make available a sum equal to that allocated by the Department.
