

It was the unanimous opinion of the delegation of firemen that the bid submitted by the Link Fire Equipment Co. fully conforms to the Village specifications and it was their recommendation that the Village Board accept their revised bid of \$17,250 for the new fire truck.

It was moved by C. F. Jaquay, seconded by Dr. E. K. Elmer and passed that the recommendations of the delegation of volunteer firemen made at a special meeting held on August 9, 1954 in connection with the purchase of a new fire truck, that the bid of the Link Fire Equipment Co. which is the remaining low bid and conforms to Village specifications be accepted for the revised amount of \$17,250 for delivery within 150 days, and that the amount of the G.M.C. chassis, \$5,625, be paid at the time delivery is made to the American Fire Equipment Co. at Battle Creek, Mich.

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees was held at the Village Office on September 7, 1954. Present: Mayor R. D. Paul, Trustees Dr. R. Chester Roberts, R. F. Stradling, Dr. E. K. Elmer and C. F. Jaquay, Supt. M. V. Rasbach, Attorney Leroy Hodge and Clerk J. W. Auer. The minutes of the last meeting were approved.

Migrant Workers

The migrant worker situation was discussed by the Board, in regard to the growing prevalence of drunkenness and vagrancy. Mr. Hodge said that consideration should be given to making our ordinances more stringent.

New Finance and Tax Law

Attorney Hodge explained the new State laws which requires the Village fiscal year to begin at the time the tax collection period starts. He explained that if the Village is to continue collecting taxes in June, the 1955-1956 budget would have to cover a 15 months period, as the new law becomes effective June 1, 1956. The Board will consider the new law and make a decision at a later date.

One Hour Parking Business Area

It was moved by C. F. Jaquay, seconded by R. F. Stradling and passed that one hour parking be established in the business area of the Village and that the following streets are designated as one hour parking area:

Broad Street, west side - Lebanon St. to Post Office driveway,
Broad Street, east side - Payne St. to cross walk leading from
Peckham property to park,

Lebanon Street, north side - Utica St. to Eaton St.,

Lebanon Street, south side - Broad St to Maple Ave.,

Maple Avenue, east side - Lebanon St., to end of Nower Market
Building,

Maple Avenue, west side - Jaquay Ins. Off. to Lebanon St.,

Eaton Street, east side - No parking at any time,

Eaton Street, west side - Lebanon St. to cross walk leading from
Utica St.,

Utica Street, east side - Madison St. to Old Stone Jug,

Utica Street, west side - Lebanon St. to Jaquay driveway,

Madison Street, east side - Payne St. to north end of Colgate Inn,

Madison Street, west side - Utica St. to Alice and Frances Beauty
Shop.

Enforcement of one hour parking in these areas will begin when signs
indicating one hour parking are installed.
