
Hess Salary Increase

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees was held at the Village Office on August 14, 1956. Present: Mayor R. D. Paul, Dr. E. K. Elmer, R. F. Stradling and J. F. Wardwell, Supt. E. O. Birkfeld and Clerk J. W. Auer. Trustee C. F. Jaquay was unable to attend. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

Fuel Oil Bid

Mr. Emerson Jones appeared before the Board to request that fuel oil be purchased from a local dealer. After a discussion it was decided to let the action taken at the last meeting of the Board stand and that H. LaVerne Cook, Eaton, N. Y., be notified that he was the low bidder for the village fuel oil requirements for the 1956-1957 heating season.

Complaints Against the Grand Union

Mr. William Basher and Conrad Chapin appeared at the meeting to complain about the odor and continuous noise from fans and compressors at the new Grand Union store. They also complained about the commotion caused by truckmen during the early morning hours and of employees cars parked along Eaton Street. Mayor Paul said that he would have the store manager attend the next Board meeting to see if these complaints could be corrected.

Request for Salary Increases

Ralph Bjorkman attended the meeting to request a salary increase for the Village crew. No action in this regard was taken by the Board.

No Parking at Post Office

In order to provide space for cars to drive to the new curb mail box in front of the Post Office, it was moved by J. F. Wardwell, seconded by Dr. E. D. Elmer and passed that no parking be allowed in front of the Post Office for the distance of two parking spaces north from the driveway.

Orchestra at Stone Jug

Alphonsus L. Bowes, owner of the Stone Jug on Utica Street requested permission to have a three piece orchestra at his place of business from 8:30 P.M. to 1 A.M. It was moved by Dr. E. K. Elmer, seconded by R. F. Stradling and passed that Mr. Bowes be allowed to have a three piece orchestra from 8 p.m. to 12 midnight, but that it be limited to Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings for the 1956-1957 academic year provided that all Village Ordinances are observed.
