March 10, 1965

The regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees was held on Wednesday evening, March 10, 1965 at 7:30 P. M. in the Village Office. Present were Mayor E. D. Clark, Trustees V. K. Gibson, J. H. Wells and F. J. Lesperance, Engineer R. H. Albrecht and Clerk S. A. Burgess.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

Budget Hearing

It was moved by V. K. Gibson, seconded by F. J. Lesperance and passed that the hearing on the 1965-1966 tentative budget be held on April 13, 1965 between the hours of 7:30 and 8:30 P. M. in the Village Office.

Golf Course Assessments

The clerk reported that letters were written to three townships where university golf courses are located. All replies indicated that the golf courses are used by the public and the universities do not pay taxes on this property.

Health Officer Report

A report on the survey of eating establishments connected with the University was received from Dr. Haslam, Health Officer.

It was moved by F. J. Lesperance, seconded by V. K. Gibson and passed that Dr. Haslam's report be accepted and placed on file.

Attorney General's Opinion

It was reported that the Village Attorney has received an opinion from the Attorney General in connection with the possibility of adopting a resolution mandating the retirement of policemen at age 62. Since the Village Law, Retirement Law, and Civil Service Law apparently do not agree, the Attorney General did not seem to be sure as to whether or not the Village Board could adopt such a resolution.

Traffic Control - Utica Street

The clerk reported that the state will now accept responsibility for the placement and maintenance of signs on State highways, according to a representative from the State Traffic Commission.

It was moved by V. K. Gibson, seconded by F. J. Lesperance and passed that a request be submitted to the State Traffic Commission for a study to be made to control traffic at the intersection of Eaton and Utica Streets, and also a request for their approval on the extension of the "No Parking" area on Utica Street, from the end of parking spaces fronting Wood's Garage, north to the intersection of Eaton Street, on the west side of Utica Street.

Advertisement for Bids on 1½T Dump Truck

It was moved by J. H. Wells, seconded by V. K. Gibson and passed that the Engineer be authorized to advertise for bids on a new 1½ T dump truck to replace the present pickup used for salting etc.

Report on Student Senate Meeting

Dr. Gibson reported that Mr. Wells and he attended a Student Senate meeting where student activities were discussed in connection with littering areas in the Village with beer bottles etc.

Mayor Clark also reported that this subject was discussed at the "Town and Gown" meeting on Monday evening.
