The Clerk was directed to notify Jones Motor Car Co. that due to the hazzardous condition, village vehicles will not enter their property to pick up garbage and trash. Garbage and trash will be picked up at the Madison Street curb.

#### Junk Yard Control Law

Mayor Elmer read a memorandum from the State Dept. of Health concerning regulations pertaining to the newly created Junk Yard Control Law.

#### Appointment of Part-Time Laborer

Motion was made by J. H. Wells, seconded by P. M. Jones and passed that Mr. Harold Orvis be appointed as a part-time laborer, in addition to his present duties.

#### New Police Car

It was reported that a new police car can not be purchased under state contract at this time.

It was moved by J. H. Wells, seconded by P. M. Jones and passed that specifications be prepared for a new police patrol car.

#### Eaton Street Land

The Clerk was directed to advise Mr. Meggett to proceed with planning on the village property on Eaton St.


#### Letter from WRCU

July 9, 1968

The regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees was held on Tuesday evening, July 9, 1968 at 7:30 P. M. in the Village Office. Present were Mayor E. K. Elmer, Trustees J. H. Wells, P. M. Jones and K. J. Lawrence, Engineer R. H. Albrecht and Clerk S. A. Burgess. Trustee R. D. Wilder was absent.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved, on motion by K. J. Lawrence, seconded by J. H. Wells and passed.

#### Curfew

Mr. Ford Mack and Mr. Arnold Maxson were present during this portion of the meeting. Mr. Mack expressed his concern over the juvenile situation in Hamilton, during the late evening and early morning hours. Mr. Mack recommended that the Board consider adopting a 10:00 P. M. curfew law for children under eighteen years of age.

The Clerk was directed to contact other villages who have curfew laws to determine the method of adoption and the effect of the law after adoption.

#### Cable TV

A letter was received from K W R Systems, Inc., New Hartford, N. Y. requesting an exclusive franchise for the installation and operation of a CATV system in Hamilton.

A letter was also received from C & U Video Corp., Norwich, N. Y. requesting a twelve month franchise to make a comprehensive survey to determine if there is sufficient interest in Hamilton for CATV. If sufficient interest is indicated after the survey, C & U would then make application for a long term franchise.

It was moved by P. M. Jones, seconded by J. H. Wells and passed that C & U Video be granted a franchise to make a comprehensive survey in Hamilton as requested, subject to the Village Attorney's approval and acceptance; and the franchise is to include a statement that the C & U will voluntarily release the franchise before it expires if they find, on the basis of their survey, that it will not be feasible for them to make application for a long term franchise.

The Clerk was directed to write a letter to the K W R Systems, Inc. advising that we have this previous commitment for this one year franchise and if the company determines that it will not be feasible for them to operate a CATV system in Hamilton, after the proposed survey, we will contact them again.

#### Letter from E. D. Jones

A letter was received from Mr. E. D. Jones, Jones Motor Car Co. regarding the Village Board's decision to discontinue entering their property to pick up garbage and trash and requiring that it be put out at the Madison Street curb to be picked up.

Mayor Elmer and members of the board talked to Mr. Jones prior to the meeting and it was reported that the garbage and trash is being put out at the curb as requested.

#### Audit of P. J. Dockets

Motion was made by P. M. Jones, seconded by J. H. Wells and passed that Morgan & Morgan be authorized to audit the Police Justice dockets and records on behalf of the Village Board.

#### Eaton Street Land

The Engineer reported that the Planner and Mr. Meggett are working on a proposal for the planning on Eaton Street.

#### Fluoridation

The Engineer was directed to write a letter to the State, since no approval has been received from them to install fluoridation.

#### Parking Signs - Colgate Inn

It was decided to install parking signs on the new light poles in front of Colgate Inn rather than install the signs on separate posts.
