It was decided to install a sign in the Park showing the location of the Municipal Parking Area.


Employment of Part-Time Policeman

The regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees was held on Tuesday evening, December 9, 1969 at 7:30 P.M. in the Village Office. Present were Mayor E. K. Elmer, Trustees J. H. Wells, P. M. Jones and K. J. Lawrence, Engineer R. H. Albrecht and Clerk S. A. Burgess. Trustee R. D. Wilder was absent.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved on motion by K. J. Lawrence, seconded by P. M. Jones and passed.

Broad and College Street Intersection

Mr. Don McCredy and Mr. Don McGilvray, representatives of the Transportation Department, were present during this portion of the meeting. Mrs. Guy Martin Also attended.

Mr. McGilvray reported that the accidents at the College and Broad Street intersection have been analyzed and out of a total of eight accidents only one was possibly attributable to not stopping for the existing stop sign. He explained that the volume of traffic in this area does not warrant a three light traffic signal. He did, however, agree that there is a slight problem when entering Broad Street from College Street. The Transportation Department does not feel that this is a critical area, in view of the accident record during the past three years.

The traffic at Kendrick Avenue and Broad Street was also discussed. Mr. McGilvray also reported that there has been only eight accidents in this location during the past three years.

Mr. McGilvray agreed to study the sight problem entering Broad Street from College Street and send a letter to the Village Board with suggestions to make this area less hazardous.

Contribution to Village

A \$5.00 contribution was received from Mrs. Lou Black in appreciation for the response given her by the Police Department.

Motion was made by P. M. Jones, seconded by J. H. Wells and passed that this contribution be accepted and deposited in the General Fund.

Letter from Rotary Club

A letter was received from the Rotary Club requesting permission to install the Nativity Scene in the Village Park.

It was moved by P. M. Jones, seconded by K. J. Lawrence and passed that the Rotary Club be granted permission to install the Nativity Scene and the Village supervise the installation to insure proper safeguard to pedestrians.

Garbage at 12 Montgomery Street

The Clerk reported that complaints have been received regarding the poor condition which garbage is being put out at the curb for collection at 12 Montgomery Street. A letter was sent to residents at this address with no noticeable improvement.

The Clerk was directed to contact the owner of these premises advising him to assume responsibility for the manner in which his tenants put garbage at the curb for collection.

Police Car

Mr. Holcomb reported that several bills have been received from Jones Motor Car Company for work done on the new Police Car during the past several months for which they claim is not covered under the warranty.

It was decided to write a letter to the Ford Motor Car Company outlining the problems with this vehicle since it was delivered.

No Parking - Montgomery Street

It was moved by J. H. Wells, seconded by P. M. Jones and passed that NO PARKING signs be installed on the East side of Montgomery Street, between Lebanon Street and Milford Street.
