Trustee Randall reported on his meeting with Mr. Tilbe, President of the PBA. The Board's offer of 8% salary increase was not acceptable, however, Mr. Tilbe would relay this to the policemen. The allowance for \$2.00/week per man for uniform cleaning was agreed to by Mr. Tilbe.

It was moved by G. R. Gillmore, seconded by J. K. Thurner and passed that the salary for Lawrence Butts be increased by \$400.00 and 8% salary increases across the board be authorized for all policemen.

Budget

It was moved by M. S. Randall, seconded by J. K. Thurner and passed that salaries for laborers in the 1975-1976 budget be increased by 8%.

The Clerk requested information for budget purposes on any projects which the Trustees may be considering. This information would be needed prior to March 1, 1975.

Eaton Street Property

Mr. Martin's proposal for a development on Eaton Street was discussed.

It was moved by G. R. Gillmore, seconded by J. K. Thurner and passed that the Eaton Street property, with the exception of the land reserved for park use, be offered for sale for the sum of \$40,000.00, with the stipulation that Subdivision Regulations will be followed for any proposed development of this area.


It was also decided to suggest to Mr. Martin that he consider the Broad Street School property as a possible location for his proposal.

It was decided to direct a letter to Mr. Martin noting the Village Board's offer to sell the Eaton Street land etc. and furnish him with other information which has been developed by the Engineer.

The meeting to hear complaints on the 1975 Assessment Roll was held in the Village Office on Tuesday, February 18, 1975, between the hours of 1:00 and 5:00 P.M. Present were Mayor R. H. Kiper, Trustees R. L. Murray, M. S. Randall, J. K. Thurner and G. R. Gillmore, and Assessors Paul Young and Sidney Burgess.

The following appeared at this meeting:

Mrs. Morris Bjorkman - Utica St. - felt that her assessment of \$15,000.00 is too high in comparison with other properties and in comparison to her town assessment.

Mrs. Louis Vickery - University Avenue - requested a reduction in assessment. Presently assessed at \$20,000.00.

Calvin Crouch - expressed his concern for the Veterans and Firemen, which he noted represented a small percentage of the taxpayers from which the Village would derive additional revenue through the action to multiply all assessments by a factor of five. He expressed his views that this action is discriminatory against Veterans. He also indicated that he is representing the American Legion.
