

## Census Jobs Still Available, Apply Now!

Hillsborough Deputy Mayor Gloria McCauley, the Township Committee's Census liaison, announced at Tuesday's Township Committee meeting that 2010 Census jobs are still available and encouraged interested residents to apply.



"Conducting the census is a huge undertaking and hundreds of thousands of census takers are needed nationwide to help locate homes and conduct brief interviews with residents," stated Deputy Mayor McCauley.

"The U.S. Census Bureau is currently recruiting for temporary, part-time census taker positions. These positions offer good pay, flexible hours, paid training, reimbursement for authorized work-related expenses, and are close to home," the Deputy Mayor continued.

"Census taker jobs are great for people who are looking for part-time work, for those who are between jobs, or just about anyone looking to earn some extra cash while performing an important service for their community," stated McCauley, who encouraged interested residents to apply by calling the local Census Office at (609) 955-5860 or by visiting <http://2010.census.gov/2010censusjobs/>.

Most census taker positions require a valid driver's license and use of a vehicle. However, according to the website, use of public transportation may be authorized in certain areas.

As part of Hillsborough's public information campaign about the constitutionally mandated 2010 Census there will be posters with 2010 Census Jobs displayed in the Municipal Building and throughout the Township.

The U.S. Census counts every resident in the United States, and is required by the Constitution to take place every ten years.

Deputy Mayor McCauley reminded residents that Census forms will be delivered to every residence in the United States and Puerto Rico beginning in March of 2010. "When you receive yours, answer the ten short questions and then mail the form back in the postage-paid envelope provided. Residents who do not return the form may receive a visit from a [census taker](#), who is required to ask the [questions from the form](#)," McCauley stated.
