WHEREAS, under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME programs, entitlement communities are allotted funds to implement housing, neighborhood, community, and economic development activities; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jamestown has prepared for submission to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) a Five-Year Consolidated Plan (2015-2019) that is designed to help local jurisdictions to assess their affordable housing and community development needs and market conditions, and to make data-driven, place-based investment decisions, and serves as the framework for a community-wide dialogue to identify housing and community development priorities that align and focus funding from the CPD formula block grant programs; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jamestown has been designated an entitlement community and is eligible to prepare and submit an Annual Action Plan which includes proposed housing, neighborhood, community, and economic development activities to be funded through the City's CDBG and HOME Program funding allotments; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jamestown will receive a special allocation of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to be used to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus (COVID-19). This allocation has been authorized by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), Public Law 116-136, which was signed by President Trump on March 27, 2020, to respond to the growing effects of this historic public health crisis. Given the immediate needs faced by communities across the country, the Department has announced the second allocation of funds with a local allocation of \$302,569, and

WHEREAS, on July 27, 2015, the Council approved Resolution #201507A09, adopting the 2015-2019 CDBG/HOME 5-Year Consolidated Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, on June 24, 2019, the Council approved a Resolution #201906A08, adopting the 2018/19 Annual Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, this substantial amendment identifies eligible activities to be funded by the special allocation of CDBG funding as authorized by the CARES Act for the purpose of prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, this substantial amendment establishes the CDGB COVID Response Utility Payment Assistance Program and the CDBG COVID Response Small Business Recovery Grant; and

ISSUE STATEMENT: As members of a career firefighting organization, newly-promoted line supervisors are given various roles and responsibilities which differ greatly from their former duties as line firefighters. Training and education to meet the challenges of these duties and foster development as future fire service leaders is both encouraged and mandatory. Specialized training of this type is currently offered by the Fire Academy of the City of New York. Class #720 is scheduled to begin November 9, 2020 and conclude December 4, 2020.

BACKGROUND: Since 1986, New York State's Office of Fire Prevention and Control (OFPC) has required all career fire officers to attend the First Line Supervisors Training Program (FLSTP) conducted by the Fire Department of the City of New York. These requirements are set forth under General Municipal Law (GML) 209-x, Section 1.

FISCAL IMPACT: No costs expected. All tuition, travel, lodging, and meal allowances are provided by the City of New York Fire Department and reimbursed by New York State Office of Fire Prevention and Control.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff requests that the City Council authorize Lieutenants Jonathan R. Winchester and Benjamin D. McLaughlin to travel and attend Class #720 on the dates listed above.

New York State Certifications

NYS Certification in the areas listed below serves to recognize the attainment of prescribed levels of training in specific disciplines, as established by the Minimum Standards for Firefighting Personnel in the State of New York, through the completion of NYS Fire or Code Enforcement training.

Pursuant to General Municipal Law (GML) 209-w, career firefighters in fire departments employing six or more career firefighters are required to attain the New York State Firefighter certification within the timeframe established by the Minimum Standard (section 426.5) and meet the annual in-service training requirements included within section 426.7. Pursuant to GML 209-x, career fire officers, upon promotion to a first line supervisory position, are required to attend the First Line Supervisors Training Program (FLSTP) conducted by the Fire Department of The City of New York (FDNY), which includes completion of the requirements of the NYS Fire Officer I certification.

ISSUE STATEMENT: The Fire Department would like to adopt the use of a mobile App. for notification of emergencies for those firefighters who so choose to use it. The Jamestown Professional Fire Fighters Association IAFF Local 137 and the Fire Department Management are both in favor of adopting an agreement to facilitate such.

BACKGROUND: Off duty firefighters are currently notified of emergencies through a pager system. With the advent of new technology, some firefighters would prefer to use a common mobile program known as lamResponding to be notified of emergencies.

FISCAL IMPACT: Positive impact. Some firefighters will no longer request pagers and use their own personal mobile devices. lamResponding is free to use.

MEMORANDUM of AGREEMENT

By and between the
Jamestown Professional Fire Fighters Association IAFF Local 137
and
City of Jamestown
The Implementation of *IamResponding* Notification System for JFD

WHEREAS, the CITY OF JAMESTOWN (the “City”) and the JAMESTOWN PROFESSIONAL FIREFIGHTERS ASSOCIATION, Local 137 (the “Association”) (together the “Parties”) are subject to a collective bargaining agreement (hereinafter referred to as the “CBA”); and,

WHEREAS, the duties of a professional firefighter involve prompt responses to emergencies as needed; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties in the continual pursuit of efficient technology and reliable points of contact during emergencies would like to adopt the use of the program *IamResponding*; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties have discussed this matter and found it in their best interest to agree as follows.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED:

Any bargaining unit employee/member of Local 137 who voluntarily downloads the *IamResponding* notification system application, receives system logon and password credentials from the Deputy Fire Chief or his designee, hereby acknowledges and agrees to the following stipulations:

1. Use of *IamResponding* notification system on individually procured privately owned mobile phone or personal computer is **not** mandatory.
2. Use of *IamResponding* notification system is available on a strictly voluntary basis.
3. Use of *IamResponding* notification system shall not have any binding legal consequence on the Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA), PERB Impact Award (Foster), or any other mutual agreements by and between the City and JPFFA Local 137.
4. There shall **not** be reimbursement of any fees/costs for data, messaging, or any other fees associated with voluntary use of *IamResponding*.
5. All current Jamestown Fire Department Standard Operating Procedures and Rules & Regulations as of the date of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect:
 - a. Upon notification, the employee must contact J-Fire Dispatch via phone call to (716) 661-7091 and identify herself/himself for the off-shift callback.
 - b. The employee must receive confirmation of **yes** or **no** from J-Fire Dispatcher to respond to the requested off-shift call back.

- c. Once confirmed **yes** to respond, commencement of appropriate pay status shall be established.
- 6. After confirming Yes/No to respond from J-Fire Dispatch, employee may use the app button to respond.
- 7. The employee shall report for duty per current Jamestown Fire Department Standard Operating Procedures and Rules & Regulations.
- 8. Mobile phone location services are **not** required to be turned on/in use.
- 9. Internal group messaging use shall be granted by permission of the Deputy Fire Chief for:
 - a. Union use
 - b. Morton Club use
 - c. Platoon/Company level use
- 10. Union membership may assist with data entry/initializing notification system application including Administrator rights for certain members at the discretion of the Deputy Fire Chief.
