

July 26, 2016

The regular meeting of the Royersford Borough Council was called to order at 7:15 p.m. by A. Dham at Royersford Borough Hall, 300 Main Street, Royersford, Pa.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was followed by roll call.

Present: M. Bullick, A. Dham, R. Graham, A. Metricarti, T. Moyer, and T. Weikel
Absent: M. Stehman

Also Present: Mayor J. Guest, Solicitor R. Brant, and Manager M. Leonard

BOROUGH MANAGER'S REPORT & COMMUNICATIONS:

Manager Leonard reported that he has two bids to maintain (5) Rain Gardens. The bids are Timbarino Landscape for a yearly maintenance cost of \$6,360.00 and R&S Hardscaping for \$6,358.00. Motion by T. Weikel seconded by A. Metricarti to award R&S Hardscaping the maintenance on the (5) Rain Gardens in the amount of \$6,358.00. Motion passed unanimously.

Manager Leonard presented to Council three quotes for a 6 foot fence at the basketball court on Third Avenue. Montco Fence \$1,150.00, Royersford Fence Company \$1,573.80, and All Type Fence \$1,925.00. Motion by T. Weikel seconded by M. Bullick to purchase the fence with Montco Fence in the amount of \$1,150.00. Motion passed unanimously.

Manager Leonard advised Council that he would like to use On-Site Computer Service to install cameras at the public works department in the amount not to exceed \$3,237.00. Manager Leonard recommends using On-Site because they have handled our computer system for the past 10 years. Motion by T. Weikel seconded by A. Metricarti to use On-Site Computer Service, not to exceed \$3,237.00. Motion passed unanimously.

Manager Leonard reported that all the street work is on schedule to be done before September.

Craig Keffer reported that the pipe problem on Second Avenue is being repaired by PECO and the rest will be done by TLC. The cost of the job will be lower since PECO stepped up.

VISITORS:

Paul Chrisman would like to take the opportunity on behalf of his family and himself to acknowledge the work that Chief Nerlinger and the Royersford Police Department do. They have a difficult job 24 hours, 7 days a week and do a wonderful job and he appreciates the safe environment they provide for the residents of Royersford Borough.

FINANCE COMMITTEE:

Disbursements in the amount of \$268,698.41 were presented and authorized paid upon motion by T. Weikel seconded by A. Metricarti. Motion passed unanimously.

T. Weikel informed Council that the Borough is in the process of resetting the loan with National Penn/BB&T Bank. Our Solicitor R. Brant is going to have the resolution and any other documents that are needed for the August 9, 2016 Council meeting.

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE:

The report of the Director of Public Works for the month of June 2016 was presented and accepted upon motion of R. Graham seconded by T. Moyer. The motion passed unanimously.

The report of the Code Enforcement Officer for the month of June 2016 was presented and accepted upon motion by R. Graham seconded by M. Bullick. The motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE:

The report of the Chief of Police for the month of June 2016 was presented and accepted upon motion by M. Bullick seconded by T. Weikel. The motion passed unanimously.

The report of the Borough Fire Marshal for the month of June 2016 was presented and accepted upon motion by M. Bullick seconded by A. Metricarti. The motion passed unanimously.

M. Bullick asked the manager to send a letter of thanks to Tom Quigley and John Rafferty for helping to get Main Street paved.

PLANNING COMMISSION:

The next Planning Commission meeting is September 12, 2016.

MAYOR:

Mayor Guest reported that Officer Terry Reifsnyder, a new part time officer, was dispatched to an intoxicated male at the Chestnut Street Park, which turned out to be a male with no pulse and not breathing. Officer Reifsnyder started CPR and continued till EMS showed up. The male had overdosed on heroin.

Mayor wanted to commend the Chief for going above and beyond for his work ethic and picking up additional shifts. The Mayor wanted to bring it to everyone's attention. Good job Chief.
