President A. Dham reported on the trestle meeting and that they will be applying for a DCED Grant for the trestle. This year the DCED Multimodal Grant does not have a required grant.

MAYOR:

Mayor Antoniewicz was unable to make the Council meeting. President Dham read the Mayor's report.

Money for NNO from the restaurants fundraiser was \$1500.

Mayor Antoniewicz attended a Flag Day Ceremony at The Garden of Memories.
