

September 10, 2019

The regular meeting of the Royersford Borough Council was called to order at 7:15 p.m. by President Anil Dham at Royersford Borough Hall, 300 Main Street, Royersford, Pa.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was followed by roll call.

Present: A. Demchik, A. Dham, A. Metricarti, J. Moskal, T. Moyer, M. Stehman, T. Weikel, Mayor J. Antoniewicz, Solicitor R. Brant, and Manager M. Leonard

VISITORS: No visitors spoke at the meeting.

Mr. Alan Novak lobbyist from Rooney, Novak and Isenhour Group spoke to Council regarding the grant for the trestle bridge and what he can do to help get the funding from Harrisburg. Mr. Novak is being paid by Rick Lewis of Riverfront at Royersford.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Solicitor Brant reported on the land swap. There is problems recording the plan, the engineer needs to add more information. The information is holding up the recording and the closing and should be resolved in a week, and then close on the transaction.

Solicitor Brant informed Council that the zoning hearing in Upper Providence for the trail will be held on October 8, 2019.

Approval of the meeting minutes for August 13 & August 27, 2019. Motion to approve the minutes by T. Weikel seconded by A. Metricarti. Motion passed unanimously.

BOROUGH MANAGER'S REPORT:

Manager Leonard updated Council on the paving of Main Street from 5th Avenue to the foot of the bridge. Proposed start date is October 1, 2019.

Manager Leonard informed Council the paving was completed on Walnut Street from Lewis Road to Borough line.

Manager Leonard reported that the lot at 4th Avenue and Main Street is moving along, we are waiting for the contractor to get their paper work in order.

Manager Leonard updated Council on the water problem at 320 Main Street. The Borough street department will be doing the work to help save some money. A.C. Miller donated inlets for the project.

Manager Leonard updated Council on the sewer plant construction. Manager Leonard and the supervisor of the sewer plant Jack Huzzard attended a meeting with ARRO our engineer and Zimmerman the contractor on October 10, 2019 at 10 AM to go over the plan and obtain a start date of September 9, 2020. The completion date will be January 8, 2020.

Manager Leonard presented Resolution #2019-13 giving Manager Leonard permission to sign the plowing agreement with Penn Dot. Motion to accept Resolution #2019-13 by T. Moyer seconded by J. Moskal. Motion passed unanimously.

T. Weikel stated every Council person received the next Montgomery County Borough's dinner invitation; the deadline is September 18, 2019.

FINANCE COMMITTEE:

Disbursements in the amount of \$163,843.01 were presented and authorized paid upon motion by T. Weikel seconded by A. Metricarti. Motion passed unanimously.
