President Bouvier: Mr. Feldman.

Mr. Feldman: Mr. Mayor this ordinance that you have before you is the appropriation for two fiscal years, the fiscal year 2002 which is the budget that you just adopted beginning July 1 and the fiscal year 2003 that begins July 1, 2002 and runs to June 30th, 2003.

The ordinance implements the CIP as considered by the Council and accepted by the Council. I would be happy to answer any questions that you or the Council members may have.

President Bouvier: It looks like the bulk of what is driving the \$17 million is the Aiken, Sedgwick and Wolcott Schools.

Mr. Feldman: Exactly, that is correct.

President Bouvier: Any questions? Is there anybody on the sign up sheet?

Mr. O'Connor: There is no one on the sign up sheet.

President Bouvier: Mr. O'Brien we are on the ordinance appropriating the \$17 million in bonds. If there are no question, we will close the public hearing.
